- Join a fellowship of geometers past and present.






ROSE WINDOWS: Journey in Sacred Art

Using traditional tools of ruler and compass, journey into the symbolic proportions and timeless beauty of Gothic and pre-Romanesque windows along the camino de Santiago. The course will give you an overview of rose windows, how they were born, evolved and what their underlying principles are. This will be articulated around three main roses.

- San Miguel de Lillo: the "first rose",
- The cloister window of Estella,
- Oviedo West: the "last rose".

Intermediate studies will help us prepare each rose and transition from one rose to another. Each drawing will be placed in a historical and artistic context.



Course content

The course consists of an introductory video followed by 4 sessions.

Introductory video

The video is an edited extract of our "Profound Patterns" online event from last year.

- **Part 1.** You will discover through a presentation what links the Camino, sacred geometry, sacred art and craft.
- **Part 2.** An introduction to the practice of geometry. If you are new to geometry, please make sure that you follow this video and feel comfortable with the compass for the sessions.

Session 1 ~ The Way of the Rose

- **Part 2.** Practice continued from the introduction video: How to create harmonious proportions with the compass.

Session 2 ~ The First Roses: Pre-Romanesque

Main studies: Astorga & San Miguel de Lillo

Discover the origins of rose windows, their founding principles, inspirations and, at the same time, how they break from the previous traditions in geometry.

Session 3 ~ Romanesque Harmony

Jan 24th - Pre recorded video release

Main study - San Pedro de la Rua - Estella

This cloister window is an accomplished example of the rose in its Romanesque maturity. It delicately illustrates how harmony is achieved.

Session 4 ~ The Last Rose: Flamboyant Gothic

Jan 27th - Pre recorded video release

Main studies: Oviedo West rose

The west rose is one of three stunning flamboyant Gothic masterpieces at Oviedo Cathedral. Learn how the curvy Gothic shapes are drawn. You will realise that the "last rose" connects to the "first rose" and even some prior Roman mosaic designs.
